Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:45 pm by Chair Jane Ditzler at the Mercer Island Community & Event Center

Mr. Martel introduced himself and gave the Arts Council some background on Music Works Northwest which is a nonprofit community music school currently located in Bellevue. Their mission is to enrich the quality of life for children of all ages through accessible music education and experiences. This is accomplished in a variety of ways which include individual and group instruction, music therapy, summer music camps, free community music concerts, and a recording and film scoring studio. Mr. Martel advised the Arts Council that their current challenge is that they will be losing the Eastgate location in June of this year, and relocation expenses are projected to be extremely high due to the need for soundproof premises. They are planning to decentralize their current operation by moving to a smaller space and adding satellite locations in nearby communities. They are interested in Mercer Island for this purpose. Mr. Martel indicated that they are especially interested in the new performance center and a partnership with Youth Theatre Northwest.

Chair, Jane Ditzler, asked Mr. Martel what Music Works Northwest is looking for from the Arts Council. He replied that it is an expensive proposition to relocate the school and they do not have that money. They need community support to help fund the relocation and in finding a convenient space to relocate. Initially, they will need about 2,000 square feet which will provide them with approximately four individual studios plus a classroom. Jane stated that the Arts Council does not fund outside organizations, but they could help promote what they are doing and perhaps help with finding a space on Mercer Island. Jane wished Mr. Martel and Music Works Northwest the best. She indicated that the Arts Council will review his requests and let him know what is possible.

At this point, Mr. Martel left the meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Jane reported that 'Arts Day' in Olympia is scheduled for February 5, from 8 am to 3 pm. She is planning to attend. Karen Kaser and Linda Iwanyk indicated that they would be interested in attending as well. Jane suggested they carpool.

Jane confirmed that Dale Cox is working with Diane Mortenson, Recreation Superintendent, to donate a bench in memory of Darcy Cox.

Annual Reports and Work Plans will go to the City Council for approval in late February or early March. Amber indicated she has most of the Annual Report information needed. Jane asked committee chairs to start on their portion of the Work Plan.

Public Art

An Tootill, Chair

An reported that a "call for artist" will go out for the Tennis Wall mural on Monday. Jane asked about the status of the Mosaic project. Amber stated with the budget freeze at the end of last year we didn't have any money for this project. It was approved by the Arts Council, so now that we are in the new budget year, we can proceed with that project.

Collection Management

Mireva Lewin, Lead

Mireya Lewin stated that she wasn't at the last meeting but understands that the Arts Council would like more information before proceeding with Stqry. Mireya reviewed the proposal from Stqry and what would be required from the Arts Council.

Suzanne made a motion to approve and engage Stqry to provide an online presence of our public art and to publicize Arts Council Events.

The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Mireya will contact Jennifer Smith from Stqry and invite her to the February Arts Council meeting to make a presentation to the Arts Council. In the meantime Arts Council members will review their website to help formulate a better understanding of what they can do, and what the Arts Council wants to achieve with the site. Amber indicated that we should have the money in our budget to pay the fee for the first year.

Community Relations Chair,

Bonnie Bradley Philanthropy and Development

Adjournment

Bonnie stated that she would like to see the Arts Council make fundraising and developing community relations more of a priority. She would like to create and formalize a philanthropy program, and tie it to the budget. She suggested taking our strategic plan, costing it out for the year, and then set that as the fundraising goal. It would then be a matter of making a plan to raise it, using things like auctions, galas, raffles for artwork, quilts, etc. It could then be monitored to see what works and what doesn't. Bonnie stated that she would like to see this going forward with our new budget. Amber stated that staff is beginning work on the 2015-2016 budget which will be finalized this summer.

Jane commented that in the past the Arts Council has successfully held fundraisers - auctions, dances and other events. Recent fundraising attempts have not done as well, and she thinks it may be because there is now so much more available for the public to choose from, that nothing does well. Susan felt that it is important for the Arts Council to communicate to the community who they are and what they do in order to become better known and for fundraising to be effective.

Mireya noted that there is the possibility of getting donations through Stqry. The Arts Council will have a donation button on the Stqry website. Stqry processes the donations and charges a small processing fee.

Bonnie stated that for this year she would really like to see the mosaics get going again. Amber stated that the Arts Council applied for a grant to accomplish this, but didn't get it. However, she felt that there should be money available in the budget to pay Sandi and Jose to submit a proposal. Their proposal would then go to the City Council with a request for approval to fund the project from 1% for the Arts.
