PROS PLAN 2020 UPDATE – Ryan Daly, Interim Parks & Recreation Director

Daly shared high-level information about the process for updating the City's Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PROS) Plan. The January 2020 Arts Council meeting will be a joint session with the Parks and Recreation Commission and Conservation Technix, the consulting firm assisting with the planning process.

2019 Budget Report – Sarah Bluvus

Bluvus reported that \$9,197.13 remains in the Arts Council's 2019 operational budget.

Aubrey Davis Park Arts & Culture/Placemaking Vision Draft – Master Plan ad-hoc committee

The ad-hoc committee collected board member feedback to edit the full Aubrey Davis Park Master Plan (ADMP) arts and culture vision document. The draft document will be included as an appendix with the full draft ADMP reviewed by City Council beginning Tuesday, October 15. Barnes encouraged board members to attend the City Council study session on 10/15 to advocate for the vision.

Planning for November 2019 Meeting – All

The November meeting will focus on evaluating 2019 successes and challenges, analyzing results from the community survey, and reviewing the 2020 operational budget. Vivion, Barnes, and Bluvás will send needs for preparing for this meeting by November 4.

Chair Report – Erin Vivion

Vivion attended several arts-related meetings and convenings over the last month, including the King County Local Arts Agency (LAA) meeting in Newcastle. She also reminded board members about upcoming networking and professional/educational development opportunities in the field:

- 2019 Northwest Public Art Consortium (NoWPAC) Conference, October 23-25, Seattle

Literary – Erik Gordon

The next Friday Night Films screenings are:

- Friday, October 25: *Loving Vincent* – Aljoya will host an arts reception for their new exhibit from 5-7 pm and the film program begins at 7:30 pm.
- Friday November 1, 7:30 pm: *Swing Time*

Community Relations – Damian Schwiethale

The board provided feedback about a draft Let's Talk page and messaging about the "public art pipeline" idea. Schwiethale and Bluvás will meet to update the site and bring another draft to the next meeting.

Mostly Music in the Park – Matt Lome

Lome recapped the 2019 concert series and discussed preliminary planning for the 2020 series. The event needs a committee co-chair to assist Lome with organizing, and he asked the board to consider slightly increasing the budget for next year to cover rising sound engineering costs.

Special Projects – Gaylene Vaden, Chair

Vaden, Shakes, and Bluvás had to cancel their meeting about the Creative Districts program. They will meet before the next Arts Council meeting.

Gallery – Amy Barnes, Chair

The MIVAL Holiday Show runs October 28-December 13. Any board members interested in assisting with the install on Saturday, October 27, 10 am-3 pm, should contact Barnes. The Artists Reception is Thursday, October 31, 6:30-8 pm, at the Mercer Island Community and Event Center.

MIVAL also wishes to donate a work of art to the public art collection in memory of long-time MIVAL member Ron Reeder. The MIVAL board voted to support a donation of one of Ron's photographs, and Carol Whitaker is working through the appropriate channels to bring the donation request to the Arts Council at a future meeting.

FAAC – Alice Finch, Liaison

All Island Band Night takes place Friday, October 18, at the halftime show at the Mercer Island High School varsity football game and features students from all bands in the school district.

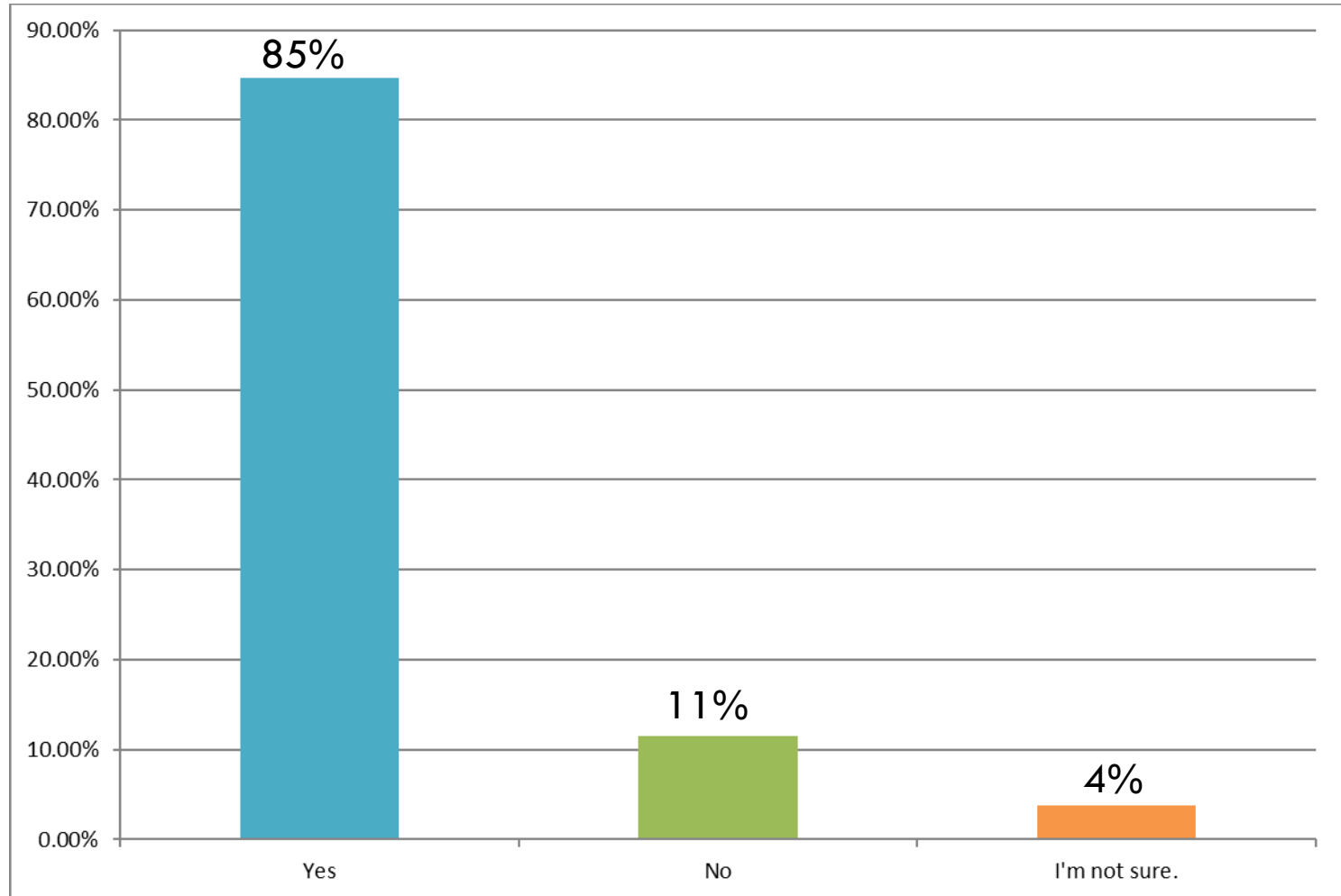
80% of respondents identified as White and **17% identified** as Asian/Pacific Islander.

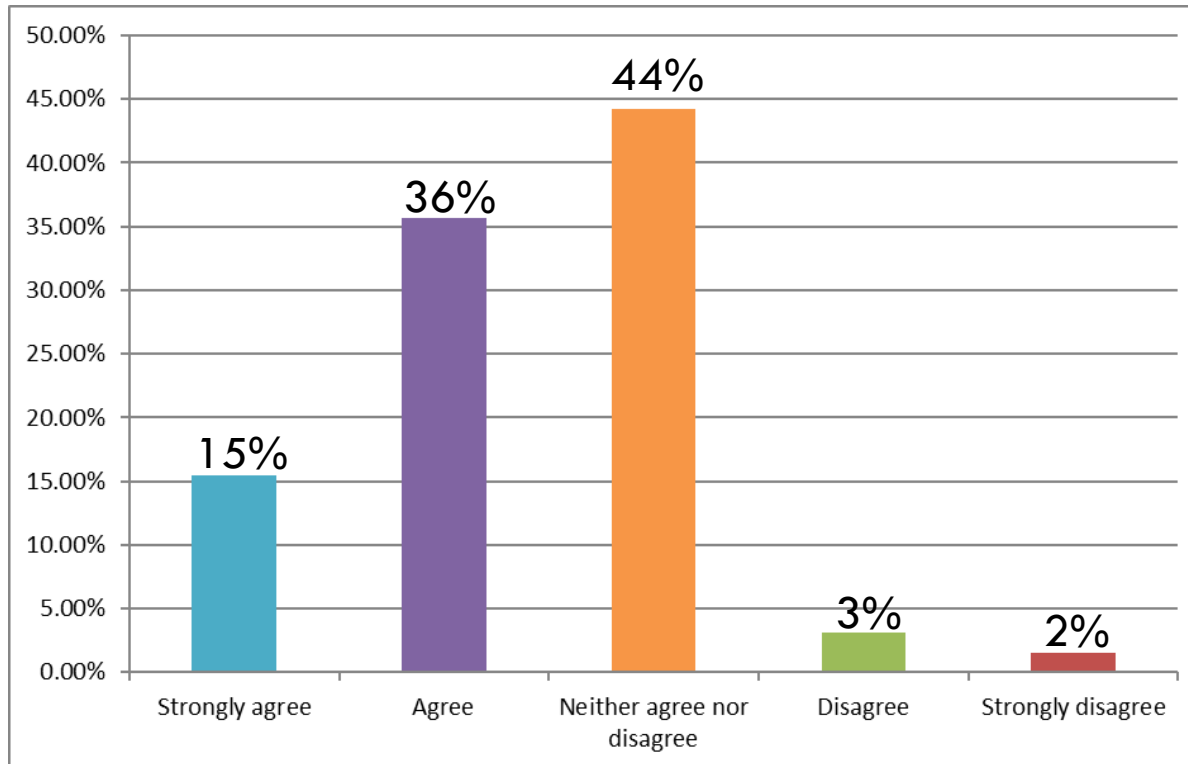
Are you aware of the Mercer Island Arts Council?

Survey-takers were presented with the Arts Council's mission and then responded with the degree to which they agreed with the following statement:

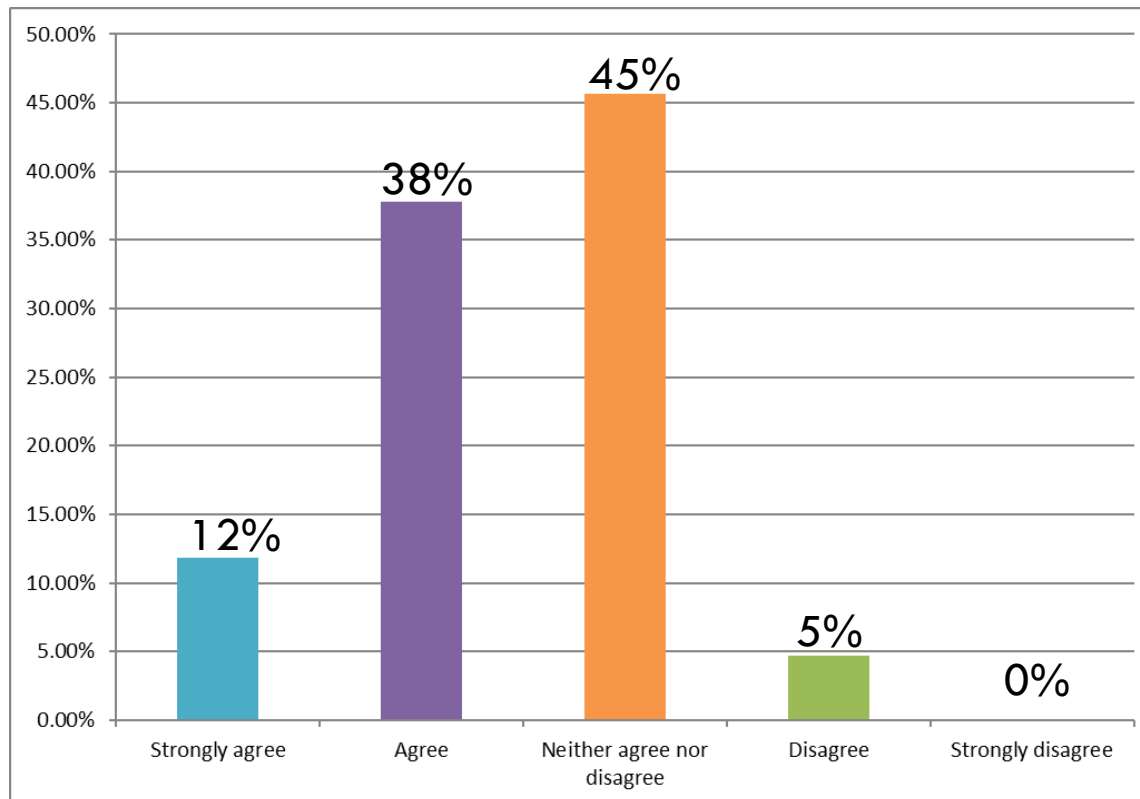
I believe the Arts Council is advancing this mission with its current programs and initiatives.

Survey-takers were presented with the Arts Council's goals and then responded with the degree to which they agreed with the following statement:

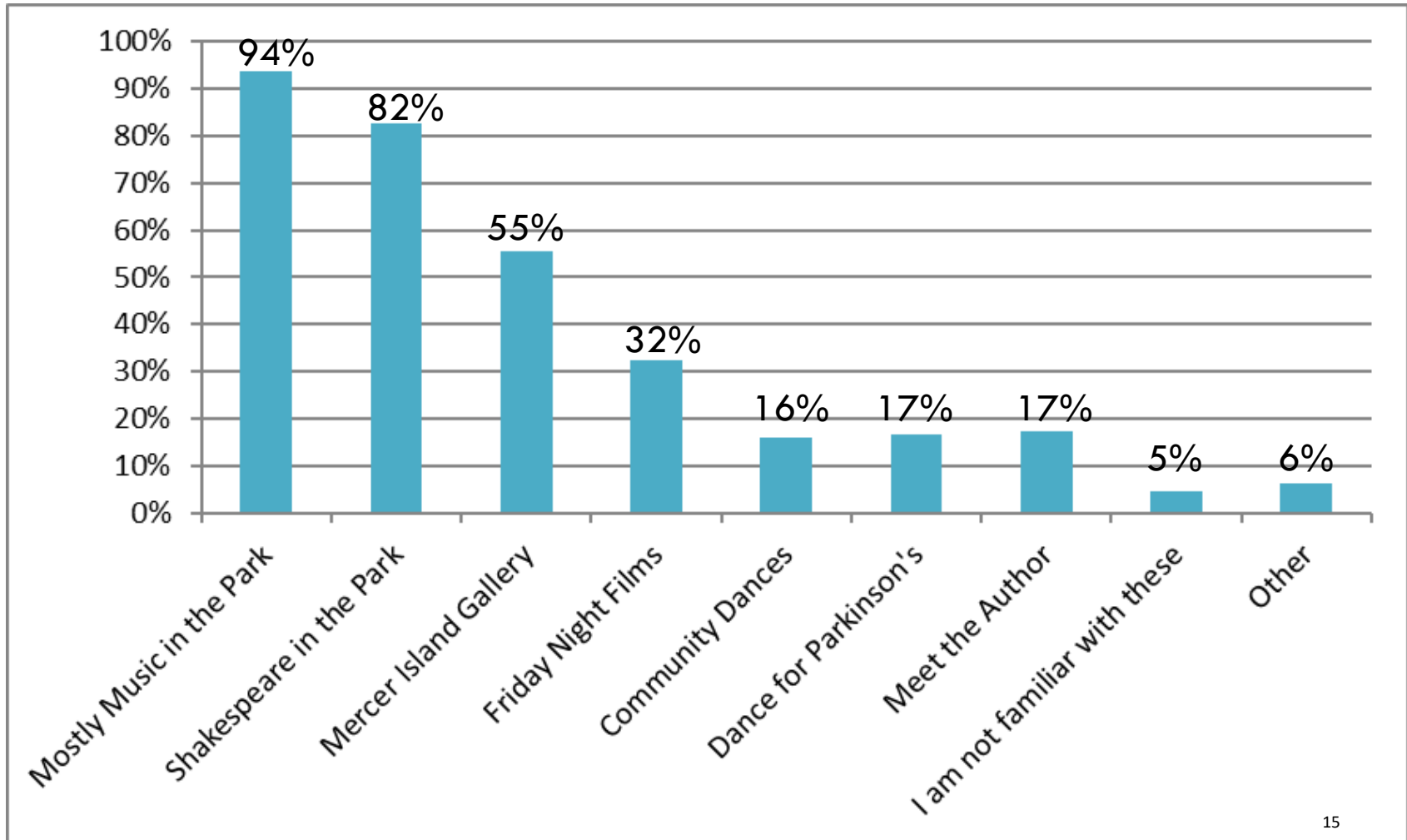

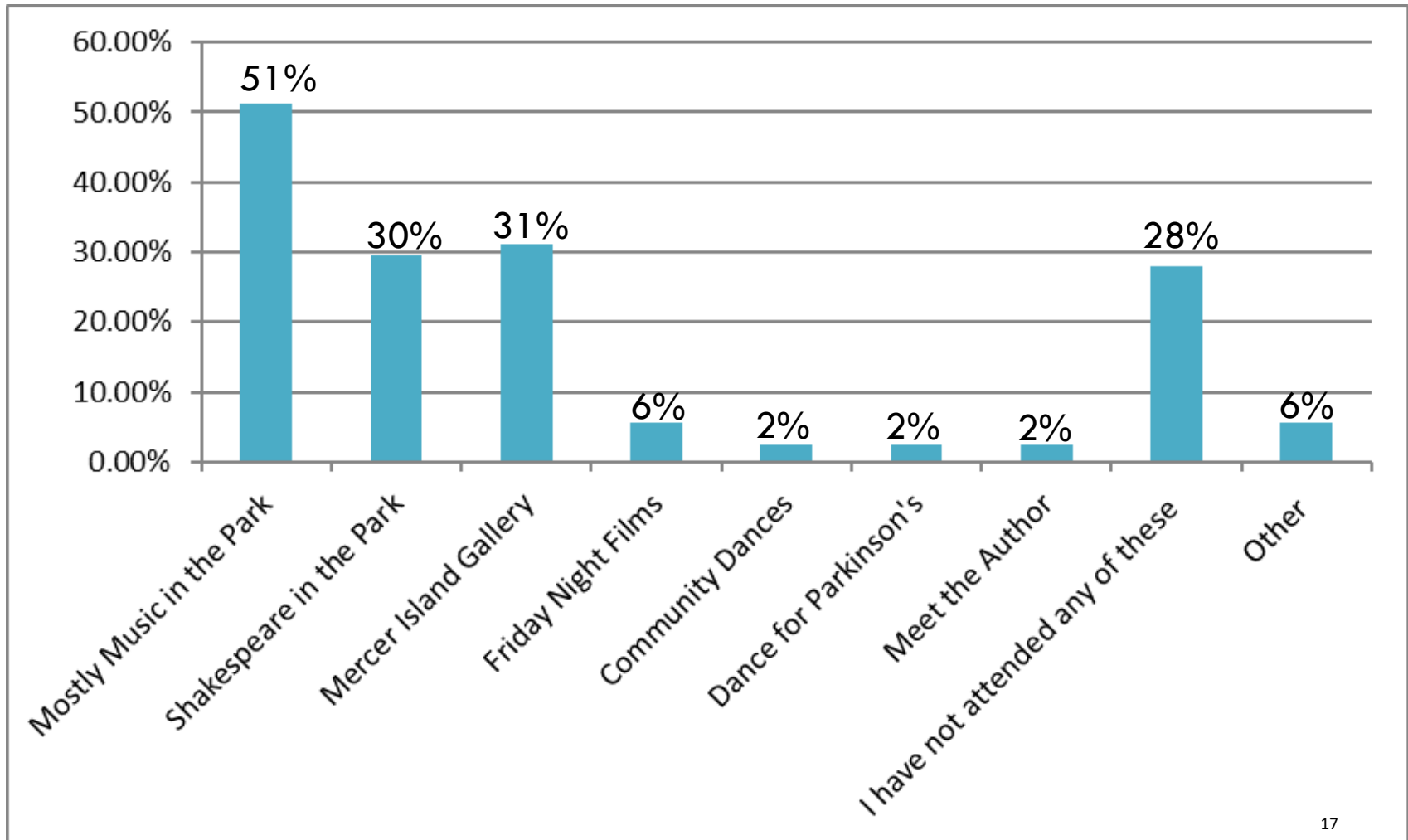

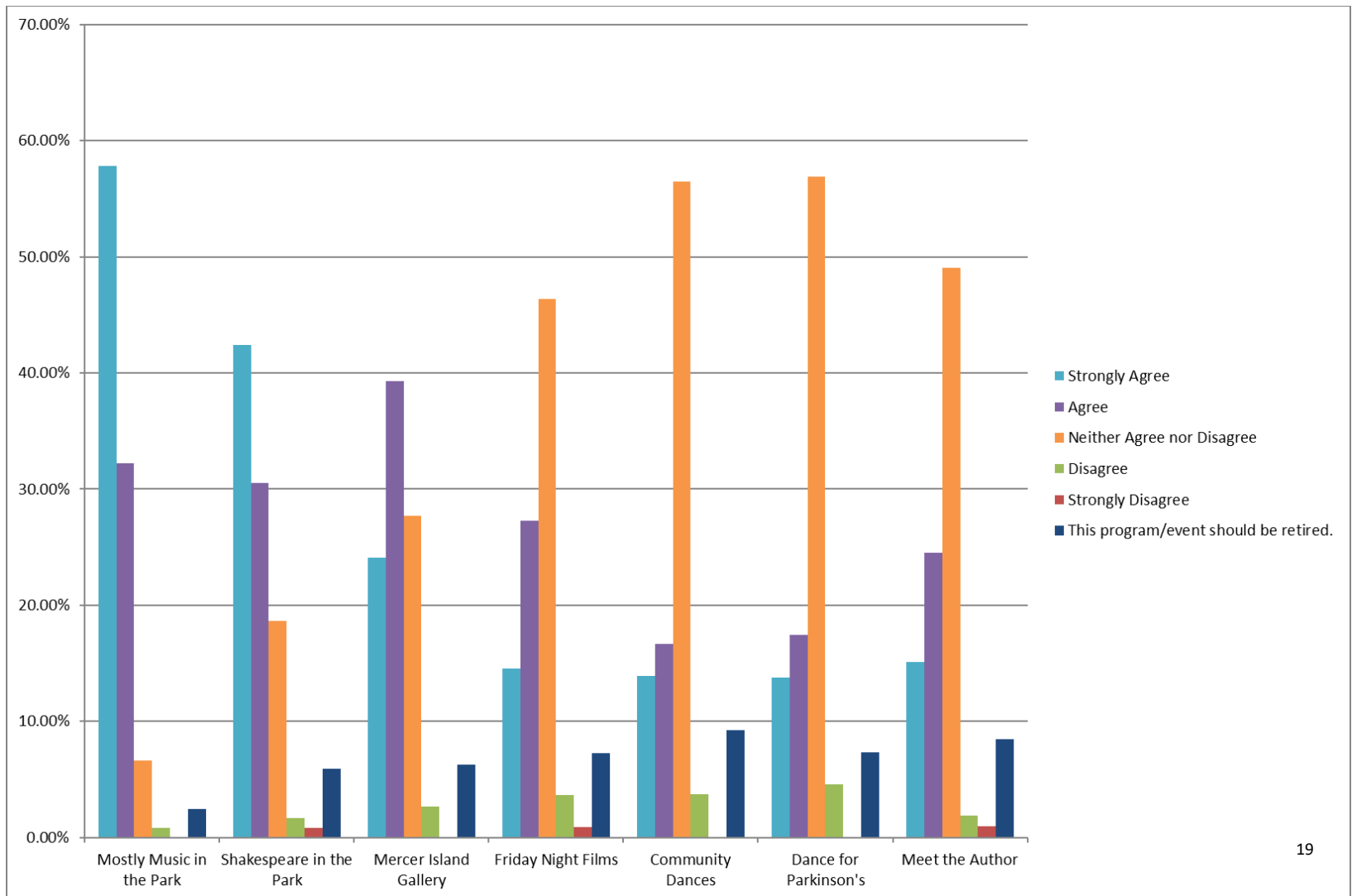

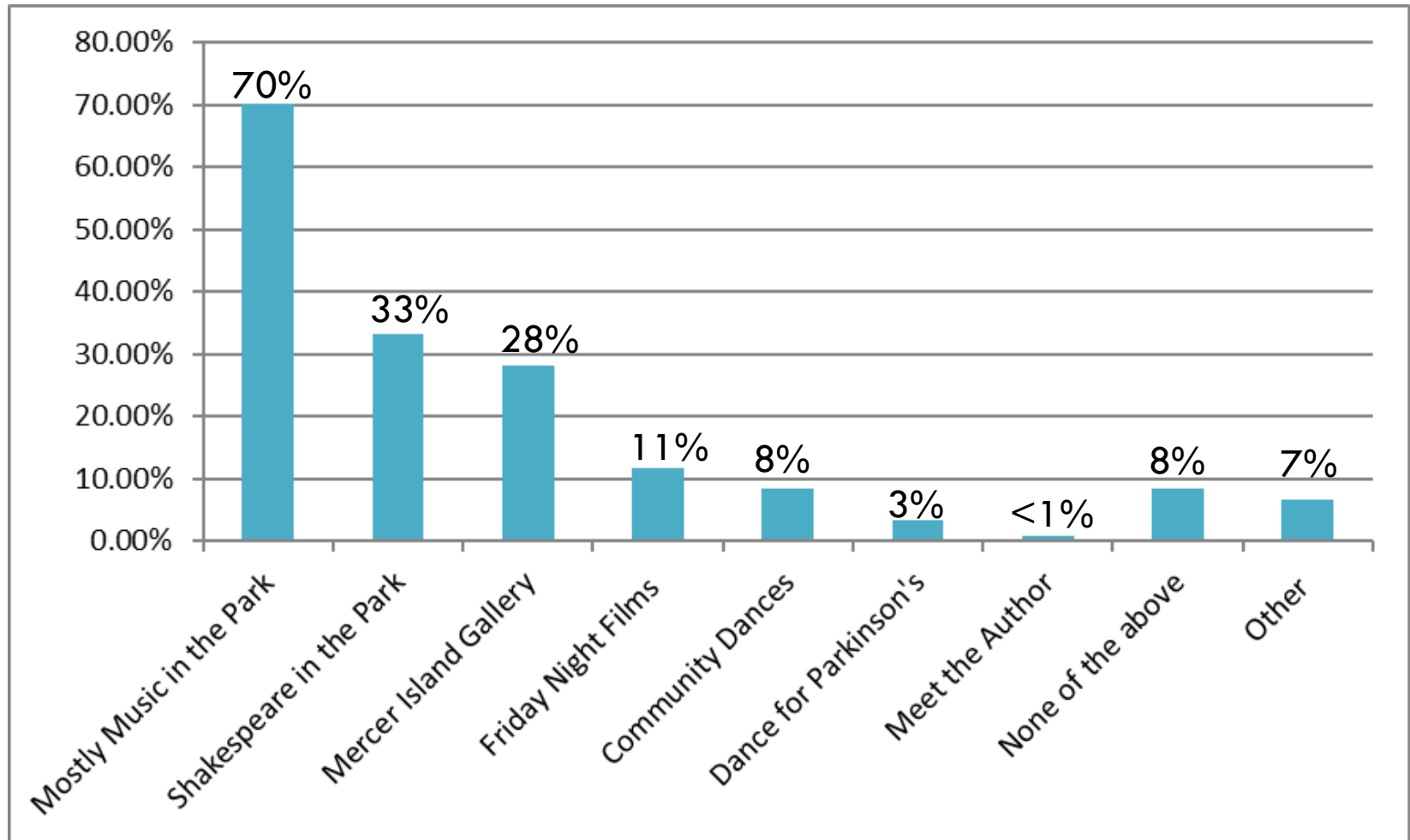

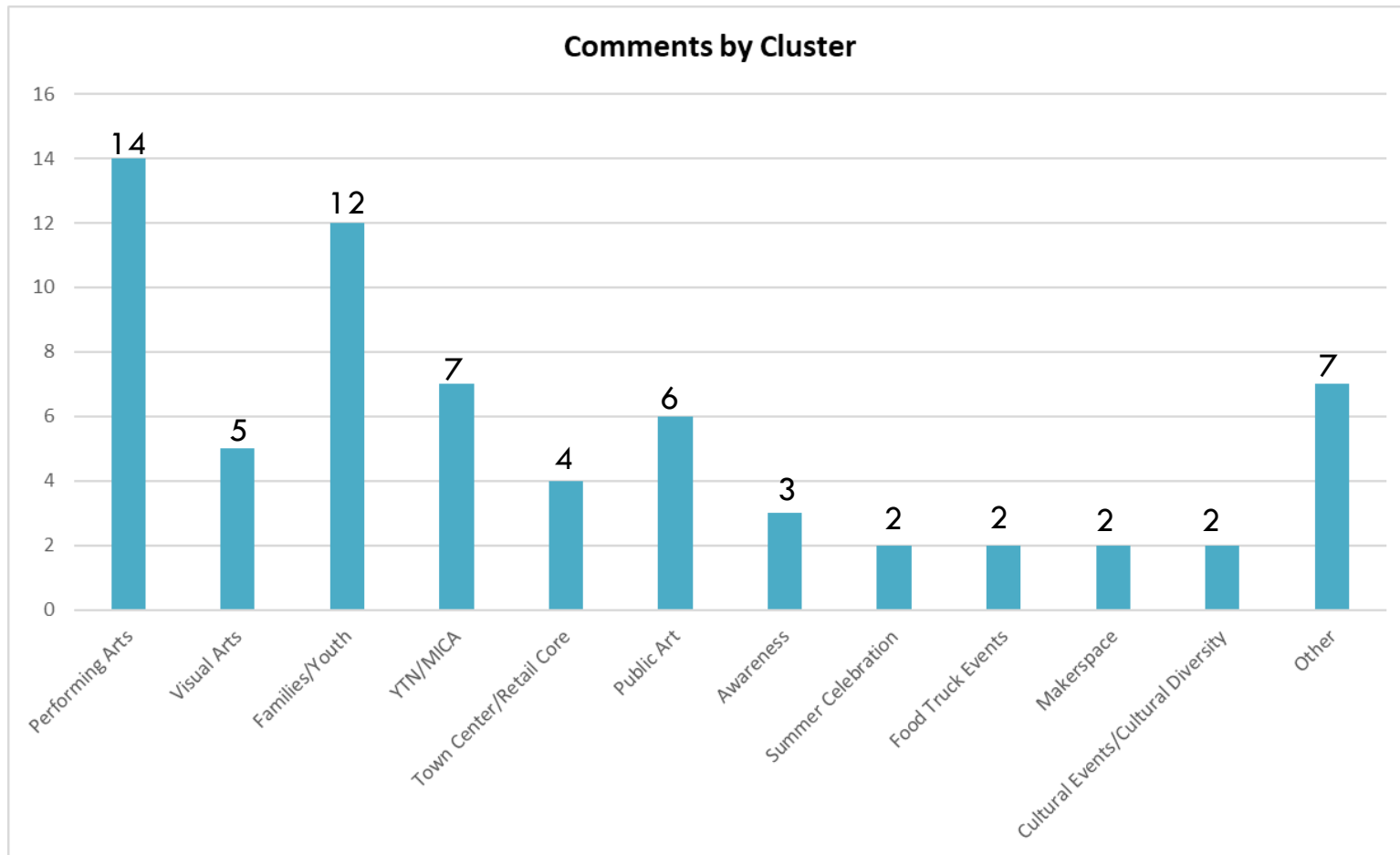

Comments for Q5

Performing Arts (music, theater, dance, etc.)

- “I wish we have seniors dance with a good music at the community center with small charge.” [sic]
- “More local artist showcases, including musicians with original material”
- “Street musicians in the towncenter [sic]”
- “Community Center classical music events”
- “Indoor music and/or theater programming during the winter/spring”
- “Live band, Broadway, and concerts”
- “Music event in the fall or winter on a Fri/Sat night. We need more activities when it is rainy.”
- “It would be nice to see more opportunities to see or feature local dance or performing arts groups, perhaps especially something geared toward or for children. Potential partnerships could occur perhaps with village theater, spectrum dance company, Seattle children’s theater or local dance/theater schools on the island, perhaps even the drama programs at IMS and MIHS.”
- “Also, I love Poetry Slams and can be a wonderful evening gathering for all ages. Would be cool to see some sort of ‘open mic’ type night perhaps co-sponsored with the JCC, MIHS, or YTN.”
- “More performing [sic] arts that are unique. More dance and collaboration with professional (not amateur) performing arts groups and artists.”
- “More theater”
- “I’d love to see Music in the Park expanded to be year-round, moving into the gym at the community center during winter months. It’s a program that delights old and young alike.”
- “No - Drop all programs except Music in the Park”
- “Opera”

Comments for Q5

Families/Youth

- “After school programs for kids. We need more options on Mercer island and what away to cultivate a love and appreciation for art than introduce at an early age.”
- “Children’s art classes or other after school arts and/ or music programming would be welcomed by our family!”
- “Those all feel geared towards an older crowd, maybe I’m wrong, but would love to see more geared towards young kids. Families.”
- “More family friendly events”
- “It would be nice to see more opportunities to see or feature local dance or performing arts groups, perhaps especially something geared toward or for children. Potential partnerships could occur perhaps with village theater, spectrum dance company, Seattle children’s theater or local dance/theater schools on the island, perhaps even the drama programs at IMS and MIHS. - “More kid focused art or actual art events for families.”
- “Things that engage children”

- “I'd love to see the Mercer Island Arts have its own center on the Island for performance, ballet, YTN, etc...”
- “Does the Arts Council support Youth Theater NW in any capacity? It is very valuable to the community.”

Comments for Q5

Public Art

- “I am still disturbed at the dollars spent painting the mural on west mercer way at the i-90 on ramp. It is a depressing mural and i would prefer those dollars went to the school for new books for the kids. Or, let the kids paint the mural. Poor choice of allocating funds.”
- “Neighborhood art displays: provide leadership & ideas for neighborhoods to self-promote art on the streets or decorate mailboxes or something like this”
- “Community wide votes on any new art purchases”
- “Guided tours of public art installations”
- “Walking tour of outdoor art [and] walking tour to include other galleries”
- “Outdoor sculpture walk and walking map of our outdoor sculptures.”

Town Center/Retail Core

- “Pop up events in the Town Center to encourage more pedestrian activity.”
- “Would like to see more in our Town Center Retail Core instead of outside like at the Hadley Plaza or other plaza, not at Mercerdale or Luther Burbank Parks.”
- “Street musicians in the towncenter [sic]”
- “I would like to see events in our Retail Core, not in Luther Burbank Park, Mercerdale Park or at the Community Center. We want to attract residents to return to Town Center and your assistance making this happen would be much appreciated.”

- “Annual Community Art for All - provide a maker space [sic] and supplies for art projects for adults and kids.”

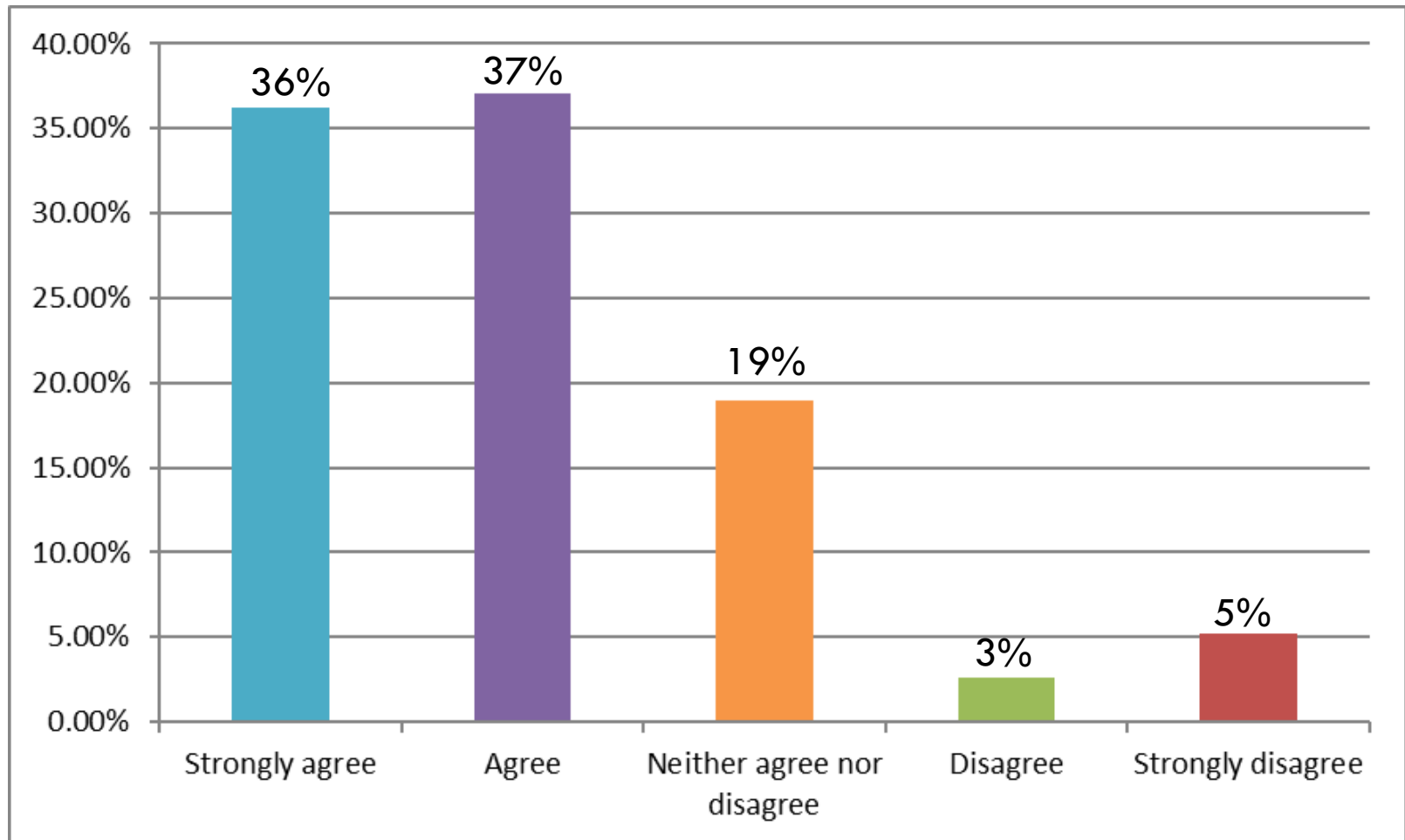
Other

- “Charity show for some reasons”

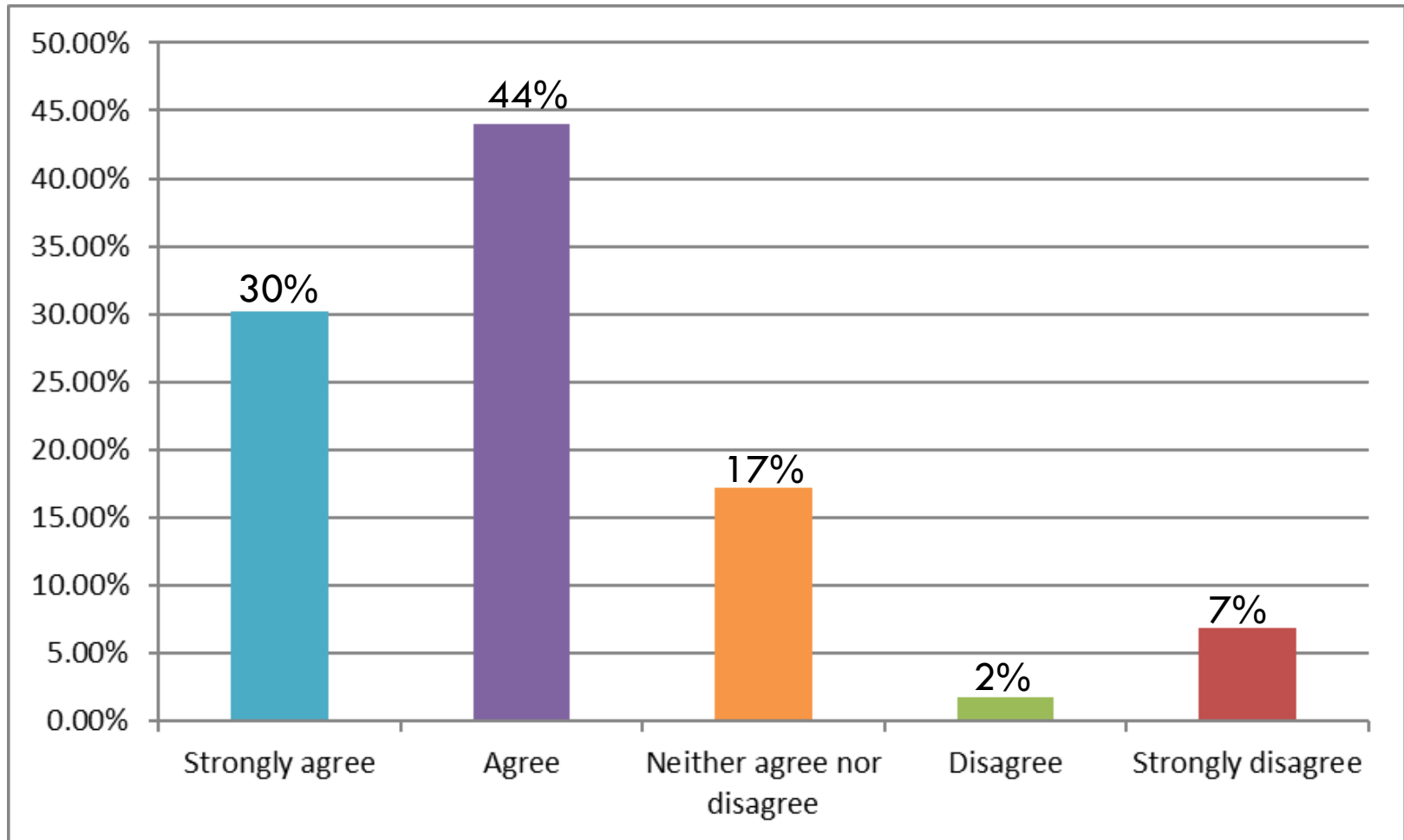


Final Thoughts

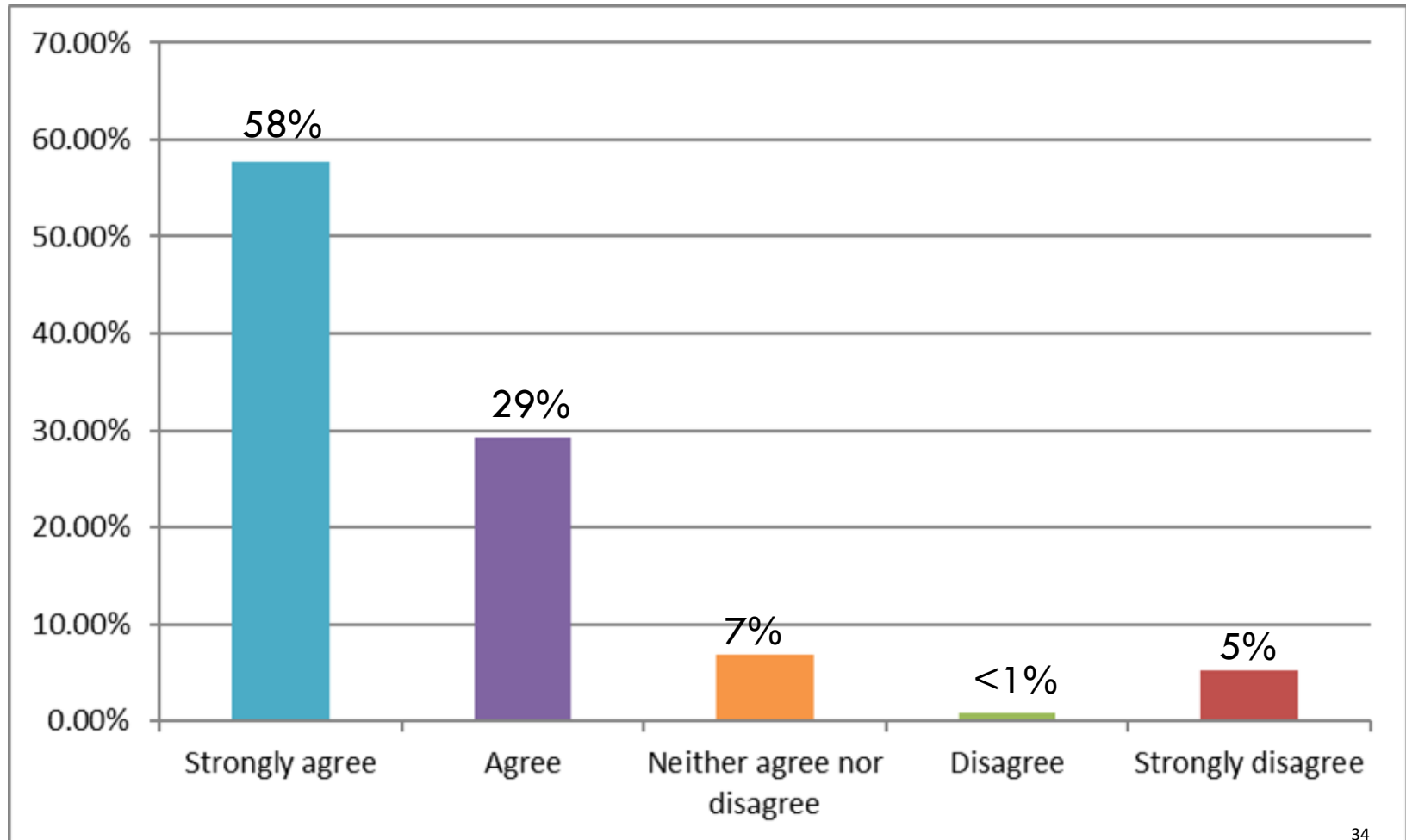
The Mercer Island Arts Council is an important commission of citizen volunteers that enables and cultivates an arts environment on the Island.
