






City of Mercer Island Telephone Survey April 2014

Methodology

- Live telephone survey of registered voters in the City of Mercer Island
- Conducted April 6th-9th, 2014
- 304 total interviews
- Margin of error: ±5.8% points
- Interviewing conducted by trained, professional interviewers

Please note that due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to exactly 100%.

Most Important Problem


Tolling has replaced education/school funding as the top mentioned problem.


Direction of the City

Respondents are increasingly optimistic.




Using Tax Dollars Responsibly

An overwhelming majority of respondents give Mercer Island positive job ratings for using tax dollars responsibly.




Using Tax Dollars Responsibly – By Year

There has been a 20 point net positive increase from 2012 to 2014 on the job mercer Island is doing using tax dollars responsibly.




Using Tax Dollars Responsibly – North vs. South

Both the North and South end of the island give majority positive job ratings, however respondents in the north have a stronger positive rating than voters in the south.



Using Tax Dollars Responsibly – County vs. City


By a 28 point margin, respondents give the City a higher positive job rating on using tax dollars responsibly than they do the County.


City of Mercer Island Job Ratings

Strong majorities give positive job ratings across all services tested. Although maintaining streets, promoting traffic safety, and maintaining sidewalks, pedestrian paths and bike paths, receive a higher negative rating, there has been a strong positive increase. Protecting the environment/water quality around the island and providing rec programs has had a negative shift from 2012.



City Services


Almost all respondents continue to say the City of Mercer Island offers about the right amount of services.

A large majority of respondents are satisfied with the City's town center.



People who are dissatisfied share the top two issues with those who are satisfied.




Public Gathering Place

There is almost an even divide on the need for a public gathering space.




Public Gathering Place - by Subgroup

Location of Public Gathering Space


The plurality favor a gathering place located next to Mercerdale park. Only a quarter prefer an option located further north in the town center.

Location of Public Gathering Space


Respondents saying they did not prefer either option or preferred something else were asked a follow up question on. The top mentions given were "we don't need it" and "we have one/enough already".

Sustainability Participation


PSE's "Green Power" program is the most popular program tested.

Personal Safety


Almost all respondents continue to say they feel safe walking alone in their neighborhood. Two-thirds give the highest rating of 7 "completely safe" on the scale.
