VOLUNTEER STATS

- 83 volunteer events
- . 1,065 volunteers
- . 2,200+ hours of volunteering
- Events in **14 different parks** across the island
- Removed over 22,000 sq ft of ivy (that's around 10 tennis courts)
- Planted 1,172 native trees and shrubs

FOREST STEWARD ENGAGEMENT

• 3 FS Orientations

- Welcomed 18 new stewards
- Stewards led 20 events of 269 volunteers totaling 577 hours
- Our 17 most active stewards put in an additional 561 hours
- Held 3 training courses for Stewards on planting techniques, pruning, and the history of Wildwood Park.
- Added Stewards to 5 new parks on the Island!



PARTNERSHIPS

In 2023 we were able to establish new and deeper partnerships with many local organizations.

Sathya Sai has adopted Clarke Beach Park, and has been putting in a lot of hard work removing ivy. In 2023 they held 4 events. They will continue their stewardship of the park with monthly events scheduled for the Spring through Fall of 2024.





Mountain Bike Club has been helping with various stewardship events since 2021. In 2023, with the building of the Bike Skills Area, they stepped up to the plate to help care for the forest in and around the construction area. They helped at 5 events where they removed ivy, salvaged sword ferns, built a splitrail fence, and planted around 300 native plants and shrubs. They will continue to volunteer in 2024 to help care for both the Bike Skills Area and trails in Pioneer Park.

Scouts– An eagle scout from Troop 457 help build the first part of the fence at the Bike Skills Area. We also had continued support from troop 624 in First Hill, Pack 668 at Island Crest Park.

FASPS- Their 6th grade class comes to Pioneer Park 3 times a year to remove ivy and plant! The kindergarten and 1st grade classes continued to work and play in Island Crest Park.






Rotary- 3 Rotarians attended our Forest Steward Trainings throughout the year, this will allow the Rotary Club to do more stewardship events annually at Rotary park and other parks in the island.

DATA ANALYSIS



This graph shows the number of events offered per month in 2022 and 2023. The position went from seasonal to LTE and was able to provide more monthly opportunities (both educational and volunteer-based).



This graph shows the number of participants per event in 2023. The trendline shows the average number of participants slowly increased throughout the year, starting at around 10 and ending at around 13 volunteers per event. This shows that participation has remained steady throughout the year.

EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

In 2023 we held more educational offerings than in 2022, including:

- Spring Plant Walk
- Summer Plant ID Tour
- Weedy Plant Basket Weaving
- Indigenous People's Day Plant Walk
- Owling walk
- Tabling at: Leap for Green, Summer Celebration, and the Farmers Market

We also piloted Winter Workshop Series, the first of which was held in Dec 2023 on the "Benefits of Native Plants" with additional workshops being held in 2024.
