On behalf of the City of Mercer Island, I am proud to announce our commitment to become a SolSmartdesignated community. In partnership with the SolSmart team, Mercer Island's dedicated staff members will work to improve solar market conditions, making it faster, easier, and more affordable for our residents and businesses to install solar energy systems. These efforts will also increase the efficiency of local processes related to solar development, which may save our local government time and money.

SolSmart builds upon our community's participation in a 2014 Solarize Washington campaign which resulted in over 47 new residential and commercial solar installations, totaling over 320 kilowatts of capacity, and planted the seed for research into a 75-kw Community Solar array on City Hall.

The City of Mercer Island will leverage SolSmart to achieve the following goals:

- Expand and communicate solar finance options for residential or commercial properties.
- Install solar energy systems on key local government facilities.
- Explore adding solar incentives to residential new construction guidelines.

These efforts demonstrate that our community is committed to driving continual improvement in our solar market, and in the process of doing so, all the related areas identified as community priorities in our Comprehensive Plan and City sustainability goals.

In order to measure progress along the way, the City of Mercer Island will track key metrics related to solar energy deployment, such as installed solar capacity the and number of installations across sectors.
