#### **NOTE TO ALL PLANHOLDERS:**

This Addendum No. 1, containing the following revisions, additions, deletions, and/or clarifications, is hereby made a part of the Plans and Contract Specifications (Contract Documents) for the above-named project. Bidders shall take this Addendum into consideration when preparing and submitting their bids.

Bidders shall acknowledge receipt and acceptance of this Addendum No. 1 in the space provided on the Bid Form. Failure to provide this written acknowledgement may result in disqualification of the Bidder's submittal.

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#### **1. Clarifications and Questions**

- Question 1: For scored sidewalks, can those be sawcut? Or do they need to be wet cut in with jointer tools.
  - Answer 1: Scored sidewalks need to be wet cut in with a jointer tool.
- Question 2: For stamped sidewalks, I didn't see a spec for the integral color. Will they be just normal concrete?
  - Answer 2: The concrete mix shall be color "Brick Red" 45 with Cadman's product code of 79044 or approved equal.
- Question 3: I just wanted to confirm that the city actually wants Painted Crosswalks, stop bars and traffic arrows on this project. In our experience these are typically done in plastic for the city of Mercer Island. There certainly could be reasons for them to be painted, such as this whole road is scheduled to be redone in the near future or something like that, but it stood out as out of the norm to me so I figured I'd just ask.
  - Answer 3: Yes, the City wants the painted crosswalks, stop bars, and traffic arrows on this project. The roadway is scheduled for overlay late summer 2026 following completion of 76th Avenue SE Mid-block Crossing and ADA Improvements construction.
- Question 4: Is there a detail and quantity available for the Project Signs to be provided and installed by the contractor (SP1-10.3(3)A)?
  - Answer 4: Up to four (4) Project Signs to be provided by the contractor. These signs will be 24"x36" in size and indicate that businesses remain open during construction. We will only need these signs adjacent to the 76<sup>th</sup> Avenue SE Mid-Block work area. A detail will not be provided at this time, but examples will be provided to the selected contractor.
- Question 5: For the PCMS's...are you looking for a total of two (one at each end of Mercer Way) or are you looking for two at each project location? Also...are they expected to be left on site until the extruded curb and patterned concrete is completed in October 2026?
  - Answer 5: Total of two (2) PCMS's to be moved around the sites as needed. PCMS to be removed prior to extruded curb and stamped concrete installation and are not

expected to be left on site. Five (5) days before work resumes to install extruded curb and stamped concrete, place two (2) PCMS back on site.

- Question 6: Sheet NT note 2: What permits are needed by the Contractor
  - Answer 6: ROW Use Permit, ROW Tree Pruning/Cutting Permit, and Electrical Permit
- Question 7: Will the project be suspended until the overlay paving work at Site #1 is completed?
  - Answer 7: Yes
- Question 8: Plan sheet DM03 calls out to remove 2 benches. Are these returned to the City or disposed by contractor? Is there a bid item for this work?
  - Answer 8: Contractor to dispose benches. Pay through Bid Item #7 (Removal of Structures and Obstructions). Shown in Special Provisions Addendum No. 1 Page 46.
- Question 9: Sheets DM02 & DM05 call for trim trees and remove shrubs at the Engineer's direction. Please consider making this a force account item common to all bidders as contractors' efforts may vary.
  - Answer 9: Tree trimming includes 4,345 SF (3-02.3 Specifications).
- Question 10: Sheet PVD07 calls for Top Course under detail A & B. There is now bid item for Top Course? Where is this to be paid.
  - Answer 10: Bid item added for Crushed Surfacing Top Course. Shown in Proposal Pages Addendum No. 1.
- Question 11: Is this a rebid of the solicitation from last year, or is it a completely separate project?
  - Answer 11: This is a separate project.







**SPECIAL PROVISIONS**

1 refuse, rubbish, scrap material, and debris caused by his operations, including  
2 sweeping of streets.  
3

4 On the event the Contractor fails to conform to these requirements, the Contracting  
5 Agency shall have the right to have the work done by others and the cost shall be  
6 deducted from moneys due to the Contractor.  
7

8 The Contractor shall maintain access to driveways adjacent to the project limits at all  
9 times. Cement concrete driveway approaches shall be poured in two halves  
10 (minimum) to facilitate ingress/egress. At the direction of the Engineer, the Contractor  
11 may be directed to place HMA for use in temporary driveway access based on site  
12 conditions or to maintain a clean site.  
13

14 The Contractor shall coordinate with all emergency services within the project site to  
15 allow access at all times. This may require additional coordination and temporary  
16 facilities to be utilized during the prosecution of the Work such as providing  
17 temporary steel sheeting or HMA patching. The costs for coordination and temporary  
18 facilities shall be considered part of the project and included in all Bid Items and no  
19 additional compensation will be made.  
20

21 **1-07.17 Utilities and Similar Facilities**  
22 (\*\*\*\*\*)

23 Section 1-07.17 is supplemented with the following:  
24

25 Locations and dimensions shown in the Plans for existing buried facilities are in  
26 accordance with available information obtained without uncovering. The actual  
27 locations may not correspond to the locations shown in the Plans. The Contractor  
28 shall be responsible for determining the exact location of all utilities prior to beginning  
29 construction. See RCW 19.122 for the latest rules on contacting the one-number  
30 locator service, etc.  
31

32 The Contractor is also warned that there may be utilities on the project that are not  
33 part of the One-Call System. If One-Call is not obtainable, notice shall be provided  
34 to the individual utility owners of the Contractor's intent to excavate, within the same  
35 time frame cited in RCW 19.122.030.  
36

37 All existing utilities and services shown on the plans shall be maintained in  
38 continuous service during the Contractor's operations. During contractor operations if  
39 a utility is found in conflict with the contract work, the contractor shall notify the  
40 Engineer immediately. If any utility requires relocation or temporary shutoff, the  
41 Contractor shall coordinate all interruptions of service with the utility owner.  
42 Disruptions to the services require a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours notice to the  
43 impacted utility for notification to the property owner.  
44

45 Contact PSE contact at least 5 weeks prior to work occurring at Site 4.  
46

28       A. The Contractor shall procure and maintain the insurance described in all subsections  
29       of section 1-07.18 of these Special Provisions, from insurers with a current A. M.  
30       Best rating of not less than A-: VII and licensed to do business in the State of  
31       Washington. The Contracting Agency reserves the right to approve or reject the  
32       insurance provided, based on the insurer's financial condition.  
33  
34       B. The Contractor shall keep this insurance in force without interruption from the  
35       commencement of the Contractor's Work through the term of the Contract and for  
36       thirty (30) days after the Physical Completion date, unless otherwise indicated below.  
37  
38       C. If any insurance policy is written on a claims-made form, its retroactive date, and that  
39       of all subsequent renewals, shall be no later than the effective date of this Contract.  
40       The policy shall state that coverage is claims made and state the retroactive date.  
41       Claims-made form coverage shall be maintained by the Contractor for a minimum of  
42       36 months following the Completion Date or earlier termination of this Contract, and  
43       the Contractor shall annually provide the Contracting Agency with proof of renewal. If  
44       renewal of the claims made form of coverage becomes unavailable, or economically  
45       prohibitive, the Contractor shall purchase an extended reporting period ("tail") or  
46       execute another form of guarantee acceptable to the Contracting Agency to assure  
47       financial responsibility for liability for services performed.  
48  
49       D. The Contractor's Automobile Liability, Commercial General Liability and Excess or  
50       Umbrella Liability insurance policies shall be primary and non-contributory insurance
